CLASH IN THE EAST

No time will be wasted on deciding which team is the one to beat in the SEC East in 2018.

Perhaps this game is not a must-win for Georgia or South Carolina to capture the divisional crown, but it's certainly vital to either team's chances. The fact that it's so early in the season, with unknowns surrounding both sides, makes it all the more intriguing.

Georgia will enter Williams-Brice with a team replacing some key pieces: a litany of seniors as well as couple of key early NFL Draft defections. Yet, it's still a roster stacked with talent on the second and third strings that would make most teams envious. There is a big offensive line, skill position talent, a stable of backs as usual, and an excellent quarterback in Jake Fromm.

The Gamecocks are hoping to turn the corner offensively, with some positive signs coming in week one, albeit against a lesser opponent in Coastal Carolina. This team is at full strength for the first time in a while against a major opponent on that side of the ball, and Will Muschamp typically fields a salty and opportunistic defense.

This is the SEC's marquee game this weekend, and there is plenty of anticipation. It should be a physical, highly-contested, fourth-quarter contest.

Williams-Brice Stadium should be fun on Saturday afternoon.

Can you break down one of the most important individual matchups in this contest?

Whether Deebo Samuel knows Deandre Baker's name or not, the battle between South Carolina's best wide receiver and Georgia's best defensive back should be a fun one.

Baker often lines up on one side of the field, so it will be interesting to see if the Bulldogs leave it that way or have Baker follow Samuel for most of the game. If Baker doesn't follow Samuel to his side, then that could create matchup where the Gamecocks' most explosive weapon is matched up with freshman defensive back Tyson Campbell. That would obviously seem to favor the Gamecocks, though I'm sure the scouts in attendance will want to see the two seniors battle it out.

Are there any particular statistical marks that South Carolina has to hit in order to win this game?

It may be a bit of a cop out answer, but turnovers are almost always key and I expect that to definitely be the case Saturday, considering that both offenses will have chances to make plays.

I expect for each side to put up its share of big yardage and possibly even go up and down the field, but the offense that also protects the football is probably going to win the game. Scoring touchdowns instead of kicking field goals will also be a key in what I expect to be a high-scoring matchup.

Georgia lost a lot of experience from its national title runner-up team last season. The Dawgs walked 31 seniors last season, plus lost talented juniors Roquan Smith and Trenton Thompson. The squad is still talented and was picked by the media to finish first in the SEC East.

LAST TIME...

In Athens last season, Georgia was able to win a 24-10 contest against the Gamecocks. USC was able to muster just 43 net rushing yards, while Georgia had 242 as a team.

LINEBACKER

Kinlaw is in the best shape of his life, up around 300 pounds with less than 10 percent body fat. He moved around very well in the home opener and tallied 5 tackles, 1.5 TFL, and a quarterback hurry.

WHY IS HE IMPORTANT?

Georgia's offensive line is big and talented, and Kinlaw will provide an adequate counter with his size. He'll probably need to play a bunch of snaps too, and will be key to USC's efforts in slowing down the Georgia rushing attack.

ENTERING THIS GAME...

Bentley completed 76 percent of his passes and tossed a career-high 4 touchdowns against Coastal Carolina, a strong start to his junior season.

WHY IS HE IMPORTANT?

As the trigger man of a new-look offense, Bentley will have a lot on his shoulders facing a talented Georgia defense. The staff will try to make things easier by getting the running game going and having him distribute the ball in a variety of ways, but he will be tasked with taking care of the ball and making some big plays on Saturday.

ENTERING THIS GAME...

Samuel's highly anticipated return to the field was a good one, as he looked good carrying the ball, returning kicks, and catching passes. He had a one-handed touchdown grab and six other catches in game one.

WHY IS HE IMPORTANT?

USC missed Samuel greatly in this contest last season. He can be a special teams threat, can take the top off a defense vertically, and make plays in space with the ball in his hands. He'll be counted on to create explosive plays and keep the chains moving.

UGA's offensive line is talented and big, and will try to wear down the Gamecocks over the course of the game. On the other side of the ball, the Dawgs have no shortage of talent of speed on the front seven. USC's improved offensive line will have to be up to the task.

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS.



In a game that is expected to be at least closely contested heading into the fourth quarter, the difference could be just one or two big plays.

South Carolina has to create the better outcome on its side in terms of creating those big plays, and limiting Georgia's.

Ə THIRD DOWNS.



Here's an area in which Georgia held a significant advantage in last season's contest. The Dawgs were 8-13 on third downs and converted its lone fourth down attempt as well.

On the other side, USC was 4-12 converting third downs in that game. The Gamecocks' improved offense will need to create some manageable third downs and be able to stay on the march against Georgia in this contest. UGA also features plenty of talent on offense, so getting the Dawgs off the field will be key.



KEYS TO THE GAME

The 2017 contest between these two teams did not feel like it was in doubt for Georgia in the second half, but was still fairly close in terms of score. That was despite South Carolina managing under 50 rushing yards for the contest. Georgia head coach Kirby Smart pointed out that running backs Nick Chubb and Sony Michel were the difference in the game; the Dawgs accumulated nearly 200 more rushing yards than USC. Chubb and Michel are not around any longer, but Georgia still has a stable of good backs, a heady and talented quarterback, and plenty of offensive firepower. USC has to try to force UGA into some tough third down situations and then get off the field. South Carolina's depth on defense could be a question in this game, so limiting the amount of snaps for starters would be a huge boon to this team's chances of pulling the home upset.

The Gamecocks come into this game with more offensive firepower; with a new-look offense designed to get the ball to playmakers in easier fashion and a running game with signs of life. USC has Deebo Samuel, Bryan Edwards, and Shi Smith at receiver, a healthy group of backs, and some tight ends that can catch balls as well. There is more ability for balance and to move the football this season, but challenging the Dawgs horizontally and vertically and in both phases of the game will be important.

Georgia's front seven on defense and offensive line on the other side of the ball will present issues, but South Carolina has to find an effective counter.

ZACCH PICKENS

Pickens was a huge acquisition for the Gamecocks in more ways than one. He's a very talented prospect at a premium position defensive line. The Gamecocks were also able to land him from under the nose of two power programs in Clemson and Georgia. Pickens' high school is less than a half hour from Clemson and very close to Georgia. Both those schools wanted him, but the Gamecocks will be able to unleash Pickens next season.

DJ DANIEL

Another head to head recruiting victory over Georgia, Daniel represented a surprise commitment for the Gamecocks at the time of his announcement. He's a long defensive back who's already advanced in terms of body composition. He has man to man coverage skills but is also a willing and able tackler in space. Daniel has three years to play two, but should make an immediate impact for the Gamecocks in the secondary next season.

CAM SMITH

This Midlands product blew up in the spring and summer, and both USC and Georgia offered him after turning in strong performances at camps in Columbia and Athens.

While still a bit raw, Smith has great length and can run and turn his hips in coverage. He plays with a huge competitive edge, which always tends to endear prospects to this Gamecock staff.
